PLEASE ALSO CONSIDER BEFORE REACHING OUT:

- A perfect situation would be to find a home willing to take all three. But I will consider the right home for each individually. Only serious inquiries will be considered. Adopters must be over 21 and own a home. Preferably no other pets. They did ok with my older cats, but since they've passed the kitties are much calmer just the three of them.
- They've only been indoor cats, they are not microchipped.
- They have done well with kids under 5 coming into the house
- Snitch takes a pill daily for seizures. You MUST be comfortable with manual pill delivery, he no longer accepts pill pockets or other forms of pill administration. He is a very sweet boy and does NOT hold a grudge when given a treat after he's given the pill
- I use a mobile vet to come in-home so there is no stress from travel for Snitch. (or the other 2)
- All three cats are picky about litter type and the number of boxes, must have space for +1 box (using 4 boxes for three cats, litter is Okocat less-mess pellets clumping (its amazingly dust-free).

We chose to take in these special kitties at 8 weeks from a family member who discovered a household member was extremely allergic. We chose to take them so nieces and nephews could still visit them, and I already had two older rescue cats at the time. That was three years ago.

We love these cats but due to recent life events and since my older cat has now passed(profile pic), it is time to rehome them.

I am going to be very picky because they are black, and one has medical issues that will require a new owner that needs to be able to afford and be willing to administer a pill daily. I will be looking for a new forever home that is over 21 and who owns a home because, at the very least, my special boy who has seizures, needs to go to a calm home where things don't often change. Also because he has seizures I'm going to look for someone who is closer and willing to bond with them/him before rehoming.

Seeker is female and the smallest of the three. She looks like Nimbus' twin but tiny in comparison. She is vocal and uses her whole head to talk! She loves carrying her toys around grunting and meowing through a full mouth, hissing when a brother gets too close to her "catch". She doesn't sleep with us but loves lap cuddles on the sofa and under covers/blankets. She loves to be carried by my husband perched on his hands and for me to push her in circles on the carpet. She loves running and then sliding across the hard floor and landing on the entryway rug. I'm daily having to flatten it out.

Nimbus is male and shy, though he is the sweetest boy once he becomes familiar with you. He's also a talker, especially sounding the alarm for breakfast and dinner! He doesn't like to be carried or picked up. AT ALL, nor is he fond of lap time, preferring to be on a cat bed or cat perch nearby. However, when I say "let's go to bed" he's the first one there! He's the best bedtime cuddler, even curling up under the covers at times, on his terms of course. He loves napping with and grooming both his siblings and he was the friendliest with my older cats. He also wrestles and chases when he's feeling feisty. He is a bit overweight.

Snitch is male and the largest of the three but he's not overweight. He is my most special boy and deserves the longest easy-going life he can possibly be given. I'd like to find him a forever home with stability and access to mobile in-home vet care. I worked hard to get him the best care possible. There is no known cause for his seizures, it is neurological in nature and he started having strange behavior and "episodes" just before the age of 1. He seems normal at first but when you watch him closely for a long time you notice that he carries himself differently. He has not had a seizure that we've witnessed since starting his medication in Jan 2022 and his recent blood work was amazing. He comes across as a bit stand-offish but really he's just the most independent of the three. When he's calm and relaxed, he loves face and belly rubs. He likes to be close by on the tallest perch where he can witness all the things, or cuddled up on a cat bed or under a blanket. He will sometimes let my husband hold him for a bit but really doesn't like to be carried around. He purrs like a diesel engine and sits in the smallest beds and perches with back legs and tail hanging out.
